If the bass are feeding on a certain size of Alewife, then duplicating that color and size should pay off. However, if the bass are in a feeding mood, they will bite. And because they are in competition with each other to survive, if your lucky enough to locate them, they will put the feed bag on and you will score multiple fish. As for the size, I do think that the smaller bait comes into play after a front passes through. The fish just seem to get finicky. So does size matter? It's all in how you look at it. However, if your not in the right location it does not matter what size bait that you are throwing.
